The K4LKL Repeater Story

Talk about moving the repeater was first discussed nearly two years ago for installing on top of the City's Electric & Water building.

Actually, Jack Hathaway originated a conversation with the mayor about that. In the meantime, security issues were heightened and they City wasn't comfortable having us at the E&W building. At that point I suggested the possibility of using one of the two 7/8" feedlines that the Sheriff's Dept. had used for there UHF radio system prior to migrating to the new 800 system. Discussions with Ben Holycross were in favor of the plan but authorization from Department directors were needed as well as an OK from the City of Lakeland.

Once the authorizations were obtained ordering the necessary equipment would commence. In late 2003 the club purchased a new antenna and had it installed (picture). Also, a new TX/RX rack mountable duplexer was purchase to comply with the space limitations that were required for being in the City's equipment

shelter. The old Phelps Dodge duplexer was sold to offset the cost of the new set. The tower guy, pictured below is Josh Gosney with Clifton's Tower Service, Inc. of Orlando.



To comply with the Florida Repeater Council's policy the new coordination for the repeater to be moved to the new tower location requires use of CTCSS. The LARC repeater uses a CTCSS tone of 127.3 Hz to access the repeater. The repeater is open for all to use. The repeater also transmits a CTCSS tone of 127.3 Hz so that you can select tone squelch on your radio which will allow only hearing the LARC repeater. This is useful during localized band openings when other repeaters on the same frequency can be heard in our area.

Telephone interconnect is temporarily not available at the new location. A telephone line is being looked into for use at the new site.

In a subsequent note from Richard after the initial move, he said: "Well, the cheesy little Motorola DeskTrac repeater that I setup as a temporary repeater isn't cutting the mustard. It's actually just two mobile radios configured as a repeater system. The power is cut back but it still isn't enough. What's been happening is that during long repeater use the PA is cutting power (sometimes down to very low power). There is a fan in the chassis but isn't enough apparently."

"I've since retrieved the Vertex repeater from the hospital and have configured it for tone access. Friday afternoon, on my way home, I setup the



Vertex repeater at the new tower site. There's still some "house keeping" work that still needs to be done but for now the Vertex repeater won't die if used for long periods of time. At some point I'll need to switch back to the DeskTrac repeater while I mount the Vertex to a rack mount panel & install the firmware upgrade to the 7K controller. I'll try to plan this where I pull the repeater say on a Friday and then try to get it back online by the following Thursday for the net. "

Out thanks to Richard for a relatively seamless repeater switchover. All the hard work and fund raising has finally paid off.

Attention All Amateurs...

FCC Issues Proposed Rules for BPL Systems (Feb 23, 2004) -- The Federal Communications Commission released a Notice of Proposed Rule Making this afternoon on Broadband Internet delivery over power line systems, commonly known as BPL. The NPRM proposes rules concerning BPL systems (ET Docket No. 03-104) and a possible amendment of Part 15 rules regarding new requirements and measurement guidelines for BPL (ET Docket No. 04-37). According to the introduction of the document, the FCC is "cognizant that the possibility of widespread operation of Access BPL raises interference concerns and that we must protect licensed radio services from any harmful interference that might occur." The NPRM can be viewed on the FCC site, or downloaded in Microsoft Word format, or as an Adobe PDF file.

Veggie Pizza: 2 tubes crescent rolls – spread out on a cookie sheet (cook according to box & cool) Mix together: 2 – 8 oz cream cheese, ½ cup mayo, ½ tsp dill, ½ tsp garlic powder.
