#### The Prez Sez. July

Carl's frustration with this lack of involvement is understandable.

Speaking as the former Vice-President, the Presidency now falls to me, in his resignation. First of all, I would like to say that I (and I know many others) appreciate his service to the Club. Carl, you did a fine job as long as you could reasonably manage it. Thank you. You did advance the Club's objectives and tried, successfully, to bring organization, enthusiasm and leadership to our Club. Thank you again. I will be counting on your advice from the sidelines as I do my best to keep the wagon rolling for the remainder of the year.

We had a Board meeting on June 21<sup>st</sup> at the Church. Turnout for this meeting included N4DOA (myself), KF4TXO (Becky, our Secretary, welcome back!), K4BYF (Jack, former President), AD4IH (Joe, always a principal), WD4BEK (Pat, another mainstay), KQ4KX (Richard, our Repeater Trustee), KI4CRI (Charles), KG4TCJ (Wayne), N3TJ (Carl), KF4JED (Ron), KF4TKY (Lenore), KR4TU (Joe), K1EC (Conrad, Treasurer). At this meeting, we tried to define where we are currently at with respect to being an amateur radio club, and what kind of activities and functions are realistic given the level of membership and interest that we have.

First of all, we have filled some needed positions as follows:

**Jack, K4BYF**, was nominated and seconded to be the new Vice-President. Jack, thank you for filling in.

**KI4CRI, Charles**, was nominated and seconded to the Board of Directors. Welcome Charles, we appreciate your involvement.

**KR4TU, Joe**, was also nominated and confirmed to the other vacant seat on the Board of Directors. Joe has also agreed to chair the Publicity committee. Thank you for helping us out, Joe.

**KF4JED, Ron**, will take over from Carl as Backscatter Editor. Carl is going to help in the transition process, thank you Carl, and thank you Ron.

We decided to have a very abbreviated, informal Field Day this year. There was just not enough involvement and advance planning in time to pull off a successful Club Field Day. My alternative idea, presented at the meeting, was to get together a few members and execute a drill with Polk County EOC and school shelters during Field Day. After discussion with our main contact at Polk County EOC, Mr. Ben Holycross, we concluded that such an exercise would take more advance planning. We will let this one go for a month or so, and there will be more discussion on this exercise. The Polk County Emergency Operations Center is in need of trained radio operators, and this would be public service at its best. When the big one hits,

we need to be ready. This comes through training and exercises.

So the good news is that there were no Field Day expenses for the Club. The bad news is that there was no Field Day for most of us. A few hams gathered down at the SNCP (Shelter Net Control Point) and joined with others for some Field Day activities. Wayne (KG4TCJ) operated a GOTA station on behalf of ARES. There were several others present, mainly non-LARC members. All joined in setting up antennas, moving equipment, and operating. Final tallies are not known.

I think if we want to have a Field Day for next year, we should begin planning for it early on. Let's decide if we want to do this at all. If we do, then we need to get started on it many months in advance. There is a lot of work and planning involved in a successful field day. I think we should have a Field Day Manager and many others who are willing to jump in, if we are going to do this.

There was a thought raised at the meeting regarding the Christmas party, even though that seems like a long time away. Why not have a covered dish affair for the Christmas Party? We could save serious money and probably eat much better. Let's talk about this at future LARC meetings.

Other news: we talked about going to a more electronic Backscatter. Many members would opt out of a mailed copy, saving us postage and printing. Maybe we need to poll the members and see who would prefer to just go on line and read the Backscatter. More discussion on this to come.
