A plan to "marry" the Web site to the E-mail reflector is underway. Look for an announcement on the reflector when this is accomplished. We are hoping to make this move transparent to the club members, except you will see an improvement. Things are looking up with fresh, new ideas from the club members.

RF SAFETY CALCULATOR

Amateur Radio operators licensed by the Federal Communications Commission of the United States of America are required to do a "routine evaluation" of the strength of the RF fields around their stations, subject to certain exemptions. These rules can be found in the FCC's ET Docket No. 93-62. More information can be found at the ARRLWeb's RF Safety page. This is a main beam power density estimation program intended for use as part of a routine evaluation of RF safety compliance with FCC regulations. This program uses the formulas given in FCC OET Bulletin No. 65 to estimate power density in the main lobe of an antenna, with use of the EPA-recommended ground reflection factor as an option. This program is intended for approximate far-field calculations. It may overestimate the actual field strength of high-gain antennas in the near field (within several wavelengths of the antenna.) However, it may also underestimate the strength of fields that may be encountered in hot spots in the near field. No computer program can predict where wiring or reflective objects may create hot spots in your particular installation.

Annual ARRL SET Scheduled

The American Radio Relay League's (ARRL) annual Simulated Emergency .Test (SET) will be held the weekend of Saturday/Sunday October 1-2, 2005.

The SET is a nationwide exercise in emergency communications involving both the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) and the National Traffic System (NTS). The ARRL Northern Florida Section (NFL), Southern Florida Section (SFL), and West Central Florida Section (WCF) will be participating in a combined statewide event.

Hillsborough County ARES/RACES will be participating in this event on the local level. If you are available this weekend and would like to participate in this communications exercise, please monitor the primary Hillsborough County ARES/RACES N4TP 147.105+ MHz repeater (146.2 PL) for an emergency activation alert. This emergency activation alert will be re-broadcast on all local Hillsborough County amateur radio repeaters.

Local radio traffic will be generated and passed into the National Traffic System as part of this exercise. Participating ARES stations are requested to operate off of emergency power during this exercise.
